### [Project Gutenberg](#)

Project Gutenberg provides access to 42,000 ebooks, all previously published by *bona fide* publishers.

### [Christian Classics Ethereal Library](#)

This theological library of hundreds of classic books in the Christian tradition originates from Calvin College.

### [Bible Gateway](#)

This site provides tools for Bible reading and research, and includes *The IVP New Testament Commentary Series* among its resources.

[The WWW Virtual Library](#) – The VL is the oldest catalog of the Web, started by Tim Berners-Lee; its pages are widely considered to be among the highest-quality guides to particular sections of the Web.

### [Internet Public Library \(ipl2\)](#)

From the University of Michigan, the IPL comprises a wide range and variety of websites, with access to Subject Collections, Ready Reference, and magazines and newspapers.

### [INFOMINE: Scholarly Internet Resource Collections](#)

Created by librarians from several universities, this site provides access to databases, journals, and other research tools.
